The chairman declared the meeting open at 11:05am.

Accord members present conducted self-introductions. The minutes from the previous meeting held 23rd February 2016 were read.

John Henry moved that the minutes from the previous general meeting be taken as read. The motion was seconded by Linda Hamill and carried.

Business Arising:

There was a clarification on the amendment to the proposed *No Colours* policy highlighting the additional wording. The chairman moved to adoption of the amended *No Colours* policy for a vote by show of hands. There being no opposers, the motion was carried.

General Business:

Kee Sisouvath presented the Green Valley police report. There was a reduction in alcohol related incidents over the previous three months compared with the three months prior of 1%. He noted that there would be some drug dog operations undertaken over the coming months.

Paul McEvoy presented the Liverpool police report. There was a decrease in licenced premises as the last place of consumption in the three months prior. He also noted that paper RSA

certificates were due to expire at the end of June and reminded restaurants in particular to ensure that they are compliant and all competency cards are in order.

Harry Hunt noted that the RSA and Food Safety courses that were recently run at Hunts Comfort Inn in cooperation with TAFE were in strong demand and very successful. He will try to organise another Food Safety course but will need to gauge interest from members as a minimum of 25 attendees are required.

Harry Hunt opened the floor to general business.

- It was requested that a presentation on drugs and ice in particular be organised for an upcoming meeting, both from a police perspective and a healthcare perspective. Of particular interest to members was how to identify and respond to drug affected patrons on their premises
- Other topics of interest highlighted included the Development Application process, updates from Liquor and Gaming NSW, counterfeit currency and venue security.

These requests were noted by the executive for upcoming meetings.
