The chairman declared the meeting open at 11.10am.

Accord members present conducted self-introductions. First time attendees welcomed.

Harry Hunt explained to new attendees an overview and structure of the LCLA.

Election:

All positions were declared open, and there were no new nominations. Peter Suggett moved that all existing Executive Committee members to be duly re-elected and retain their current positions. The motion was seconded by Marta Liversedge and carried.

Treasurer's Report:

In the absence of Brett Lane, Harry Hunt gave a verbal report. LCLA impose no Annual Membership fee and have no encumbrance with room hire and related charges as donated by Liverpool Catholic Club.

Peter Suggett moved that the financial report be accepted. The motion was seconded by Marta Liversedge and carried.

Previous Minutes:

Presented and read by Kerrie Rickard. Minutes declared read and adopted.

General Business:

Kee Sisouvath presented the Green Valley police report. Kee advised that in the last 3 months there has been an increase in alcohol related incidents. He noted that the weather has a significant effect this time of the year and reiterated to be proactive and report incidents. Statics show an increase in public areas and a decline in home incidents.

LPC for licenced premises currently standing at 22%.

Paul McEvoy presented the Liverpool police report. Paul spoke briefly on the incidents of outlaw motor cycle gangs breaking into poker machines and raiding cash boxes. Trading times of smaller venues a key factor into theft; as no staff present for extended periods of time.

Cashing out other people's money from gaming machines. Venue to decide on appropriate action.

Increase in violent crimes however only 2 premises but 3 attacks which make stats appear high, but no major issues. Paul also provided the following leaflets

Articles to be promoted – make public aware to exercise caution whilst in gaming areas and provide information regarding unsavoury persons congregating at St Luke's Church.
