The chairman declared the meeting open at 11:15am.

Accord members present conducted self-introductions. The minutes from the previous meeting held 30<sup>th</sup> November 2016 were read.

Claire Brockbank moved that the minutes from the previous general meeting be taken as read. There being no objection the motion was carried.

**General Business:**

Kee Sisouvath presented the Green Valley police report. Statistics have been quite good over the last quarter, with licensed premises LPC down to 10% from 22% at last report. Operations in the region have targeted restaurants and motels lately with many signage issues noted. Venues are encouraged to be mindful. An operation at ANZ Stadium noted a large number of youths entering intoxicated after pre-loading with one person hospitalised from intoxication.

Harry Hunt asked whether there had been any increase in drug related issues. John Henry noted the comparative cheapness of drugs in relation to alcohol which could result in patrons drug affected on entry being flagged as intoxicated and impacting venues. Harry Hunt noted that Accord attendance can help licensees through communication with licensing officers in an open forum.

Kee Sisouvath noted that police cannot perform drug tests on patrons in licensed premises, and that any determination is solely based on observation.

Chris Donovan presented to Accord members on the new hotel project underway at Liverpool Catholic Club.

Harry Hunt spoke on the future of tourism in the Liverpool area and introduced the new South Western Sydney Tourism Taskforce, an association directed towards promoting tourism growth in the region and encouraging private and government investment in the area.

John Henry noted the potential detrimental impact of the new M12 motorway on Kemps Creek Sporting and Bowling Club.
